

Family: Bacillaceae Genus: Clostridium

- a) C. tetani (tetanus)
- b) C. perifringens (gas gangrene)
- c) C. botulinum (food poisoning)
- d) C. difficili (sever diarrhea)

All spp. Are human pathogens and cause sever infection.

#### **General characteristics:**

- G +ve anaerobic.
- large bacilli.
- saprophytes in the external environment (soil
- they produce exotoxin & enzyme
- vegetative forms are slightly motile
- spore former. spore can resist oxygen except *C. tetani* which strict anaerobes, opt.temp. 37 C°.
- Spores are wider than bacillary body, giving bacillus a swollen
- few of them are capsulated,
- colony morphology is variable
- They lack catalase peroxidase as other anaerobic bacteria.

## **Specimen's collection:**

Samples must be carefully collected and transport in gassed out (evacuated) tube, inoculated on appropriated media, incubated anaerobically (gas pack and jars)








candle jar


An aerobic jar

#### **Pathogenicity and Diseases:**

- 1- *C. botulinum*: Result from ingestion of food contaminated by performed botulinum toxin, rather than from multiplication of *C. botulinum* in the gastrointestinal tract, it resemble *staphylococcal* food poisoning, the sample is stool.
- 2- *C. perifringens*: Form gas gangrene (lethal infection), the hemolysis of blood is by producing an exotoxin called
- $\alpha$  toxin cause stormy fermentation of milk

# Stormy Fermentation of Litmus Milk.

The tube on the left shows fermentation; the tube on the right is negative for stormy fermentation

3- *C. tetani*: strict anaerobes, capsulated from terminal spore appear as (tennis rackets) cause tetanus which is a fatal disease caused by toxin (tetanospasmin).





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4- C. difficili: Cause diarrhea in children (sever summer diarrhea)

## **Drug of choice:**

Vancomycin, Penicillin G.

Alternative drug: Bcitracin, Chloramphenicol, Clindamycin
